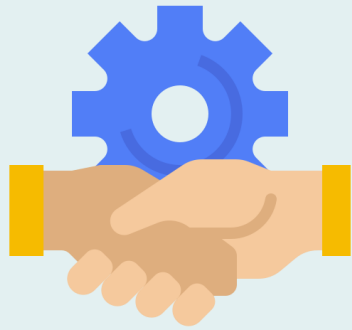

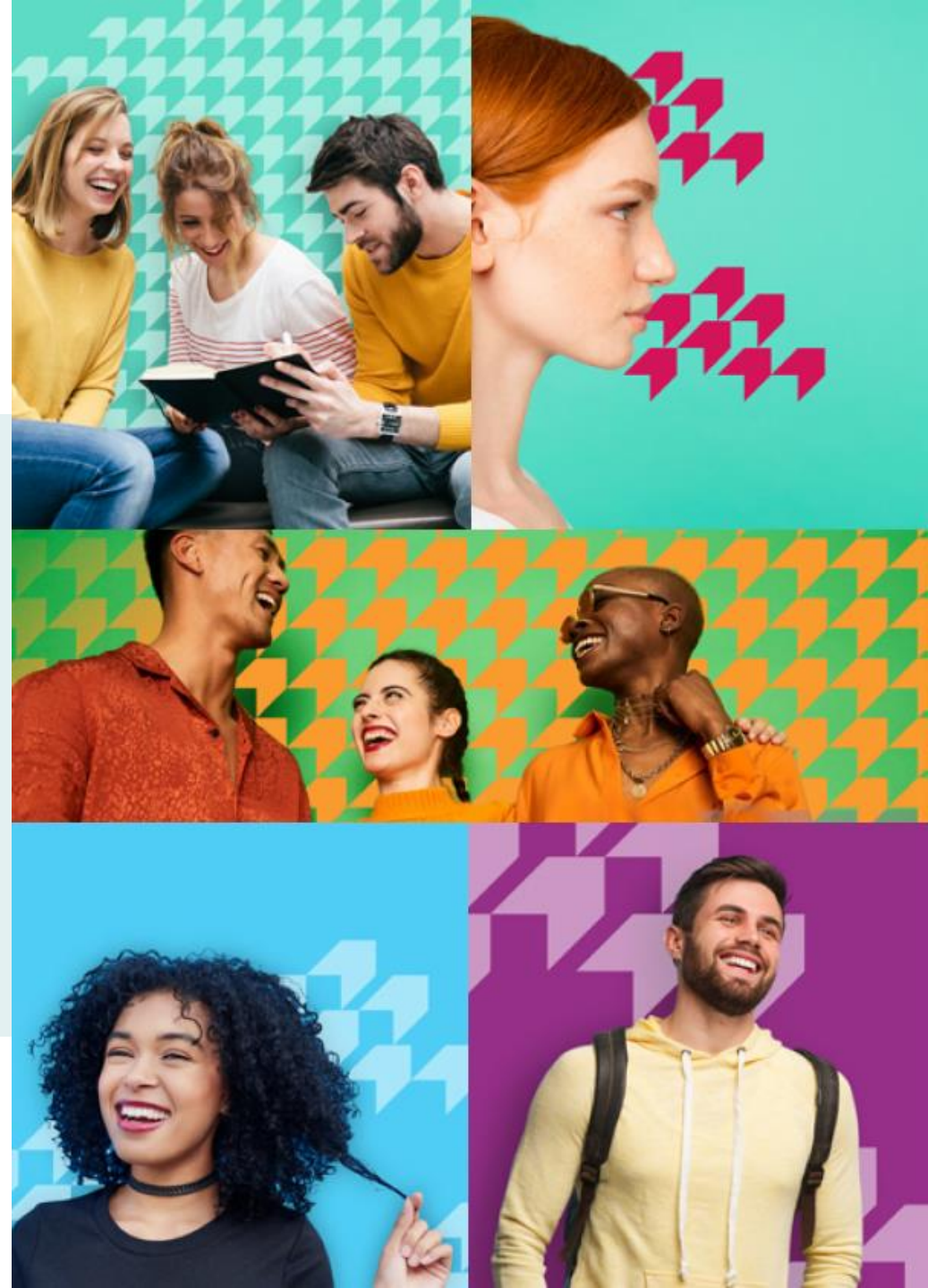

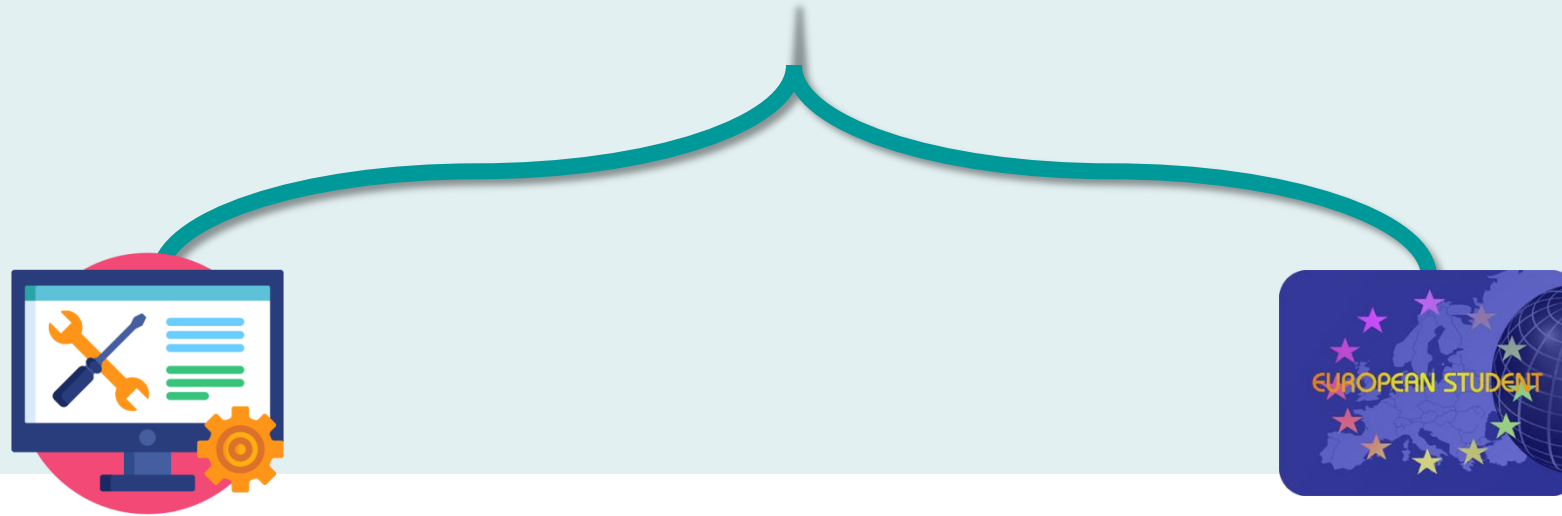

- 2022: Nominations and acceptances
- 2023: Transcripts of records
